If the CTDS Site number (7th digit) begins with a 7, 8, or 9, it is a district sponsored charter entity.

Type Code	Type Code Name	Type Code Definition
00	Unorganized Territory	Used for MIS testing only.
01	Accommodation School	A public educational unit of high school grade or under established by and under the supervision of the County School Superintendent.
02	Unified School District	A public educational unit of schools for grades K through 12 with a local governing board.
03	Elem. Not in High School Dist.	A public educational unit of schools for grade groupings below grade 9 with a local governing board, not affiliated with a high school district.
04	Elementary in High School Dist.	A public educational unit of schools for grade groupings below grade 9 with a local governing board, affiliated with a high school district.
05	High School District	A public educational unit of schools for grades 9 through 12 with a local governing board, serving more than one elementary district.
06	Community College	An educational institution which is under the jurisdiction of the state board and which provides a program not exceeding two years' training in the arts, sciences and humanities beyond the twelfth grade of the public or private high school course of study.
07	4 Year College / University	An educational institution which has colleges, schools and departments and gives courses of study and academic degrees as the Board of Regents approves.
08	Vocational / Technical	A joint technological education district formed by two or more school districts.
09	Special Needs / Skill Center	Special small district service programs established by the county school superintendent designed to meet the special needs of school districts.
10	Juvenile Corrections	A public correctional institution supported by the state or a county, for the incarceration of youth, where children are maintained in residence.
11	Adult Corrections	A public correctional institution supported by the state or a county, for the incarceration of adults, where they are maintained in residence.
12	Public Special Education Institution	A public institution providing for special needs of children supported by the state or a county. These institutions may be residential or nonresidential.

14	Alternative Education Program	An educational unit for children ages three to five, funded by Health and Human Services, not including Head Start (Type 26)
15	Community Center	A private nonprofit organization that provides education to adults.
16	Community Based Organization	A private nonprofit organization of demonstrated effectiveness which is representative of communities or significant segments of communities and which

		provide job training services: or,  An organization of demonstrated effectiveness serving non-reservation Indians as well as tribal governments and Native Alaskan groups, JTPS (P.L. 97-300), (for example refer to 29 U.S.C.A. 706).
17	Consortium	Any combination of LEAs which, because they generate an entitlement amount of less than \$7500.00, are required by section 711(c)(4)(A)(i) of the IDA Act (Sec.300.360 (a)(1)) to file a consolidated application.
18	County Special Services	
19	Private Non-Profit Organization	A private non-profit organization which provides services in residential or non-residential settings.
20	Private School / Not Special Ed.	A nonresidential educational unit of high school grade or under (with an average yearly tuition not exceeding current limits per child) operating under nonprofit (exempt from Income Tax) private ownership in a single building or complex of buildings.
21	Private School / Special Ed.	A private educational unit of high school grades or under approved by the Arizona Department of Education for the purpose of providing Special Education Services.
22	Non-Profit Child Care Center - 22	A licensed, non-school, public or private nonprofit (exempt from Income Tax) organization providing day care services where children are not maintained in permanent residence.
23	Contiguous Reservations	
24	Non-Profit Child Care Center	Same as Type 22
25	Day Care Home	A public agency or private nonprofit institution or private nonprofit school responsible for the administration of a food program in private homes which are licensed by DES or have demonstrated compliance with CCFP standards.
26	Head Start	An educational unit for children ages three to five, funded by Health and Human Services.
27	Residential Child Care Institution (Non-Govt.)	A public or licensed nonprofit (exempt from Income Tax) private organization including but not limited to orphanages, substance abuse treatment centers, homes for the mentally handicapped, etc., where children are maintained in residence for care.
28	Literacy Volunteers	A private nonprofit organization whose mission is to achieve adult literacy. Literacy Volunteers uses trained volunteers in conjunction with certified teachers.
30	Proprietary Child Care Center	A licensed, non-school, private organization providing day care services where children are not maintained in permanent residence and having at least 25 percent of the children enrolled supported by DES.

31	Proprietary Child Care Center	Same as Type 30
32	Proprietary Child Care Center - 32	Same as Type 30
33	Proprietary Child Care Center - Non-DES	A licensed, non-school, private organization providing day care services where children are not maintained in permanent residence and not requiring that at least 25 percent of the children enrolled be supported by DES.
34	Proprietary Child Care Center - 34	Same as Type 30
39	BIA Contract / Grant School	An educational unit of high school grade or under contracting with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide services to either or both nonresidential and residential (boarding) students.
40	BIA School	An educational unit of high school grade or under operated by the Bureau of Indian Affairs for services to either or both nonresidential and residential (boarding) students.

42	Intergovernmental Agreement	Intergovernmental Agreements are authorized under 11-952. The statutes state that "If authorized by their legislative or other governing bodies, two or more public agencies by direct contract or agreement may contract for services or jointly exercise an [??]"

85 / 86 / 89	Charter Schools - State Board	A public school chartered by the State Board to provide education in grades K-12.
87	Charter Schools - Charter Board	A public school chartered by the Charter Board to provide education in grades K-12.
93	Adult Day Care	A certified public or private nonprofit organization providing less than 24-hour care to functionally handicapped adults or persons 60 years of age or older.
99	County School Superintendent	An elected official charged with the administration, support and maintenance of the schools within its boundaries.
